FACTS



- The word 'sausage' comes originally from the Latin 'salscius' meaning 'prepared by salting'
- Sausages date back to the Sumerians who lived 5,000 years ago
- The earliest known mention of sausages is in a play by Aristophanes from the 5th Century BC
- In the 4th Century the Catholic Church banned the eating of sausages as a sin as they were associated with pagan festivals
- Sausages were first divided into links during the reign of Charles I
- Sausages were nicknamed bangers during the Second World War. Their high water content due to the scarcity of other ingredients meant that they were liable to explode when cooked as the water turned to steam!
- People in the UK love sausages so much that The British Sausage Appreciation Society actually exists and has over 5,000 members
- 86% of British households buy sausages
- The most expensive sausages ever comprised Fillet steak with Champagne and Truffles and cost £20 per pack.
- The largest Cumberland Sausage was made by Broughton-in-Furness pig farmer Gary McClure measuring 3.3m and weighing 135kg
- The World's longest pork sausage weighed 15.5 tonnes and was 35 miles long
- Claiming to be the World's hottest sausage, created by Martin Trenall, the 'Pork Inferno' contained Indian Bhut Jolokia chillis, paprika and chilli powder



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
